It will be completed by next Thursday and the results should come out in Term 2. Today was the first day our Year 3 children used the computer to access the test. It's very daunting for our younger children; however they have been practicing on the laptops to logon and to manipulate the mouse. Please ensure your children are at school on time next week to participate in the testing.

Art Exhibition 2024


